

Question for Solicitation No. 0757-17-009 and 0757-17-010

Question No. 1: “In Section B it states: Offerors failing to provide offers on all required services marked, will be considered technically unacceptable. If our agency is unable to provide polygraph services, would this make our proposal for other services (such as groups and counseling) unacceptable?”

Question No. 2: “Regarding staff qualifications to provide counseling, could a staff member who has a Bachelors degree and experience in the sex offender treatment field who is supervised by an individual with a Masters degree and a long list of credentials and experience be acceptable?”

General Questions for Solicitations

Question No. 1: “If an Agency feels comfortable responding to the majority of the required services asked for in the solicitation, can they do so? Then not respond on the required services that they do not feel comfortable responding to? For example, if an Agency feels they can provide quality sex offender counseling services but do not at all feel comfortable or qualified to perform the polygraph examination/report can they not respond to the polygraph service need?”

The vendor shall comply with all requirements and performance standards of this agreement.
